Who are Friends of the GreenWay?

Friends of the GreenWay Inc was established in 2007 as “a not-for-profit, apolitical community group whose purpose is to represent the local community and support, promote and advocate for the GreenWay vision of an environmental, cultural and active transport corridor linking the Cooks River and Iron Cove”.

What is the Friends' GreenWay Vision?

- » a shared trail from the Cooks River pathway to the Bay Run at Iron Cove at least 2.5m wide with night lighting
- » a priority cycle veloway from Lewisham to Lilyfield using the rail corridor
- » light rail extended from Lilyfield to Dulwich Hill
- » the restoration of Hawthorne Canal to a natural waterway
- » a substantial local-species habitat-sensitive bush corridor
- » community gardens in appropriate locations along the corridor
- » acknowledgement and interpretation of local Aboriginal history and culture
- » art and other cultural features throughout the corridor

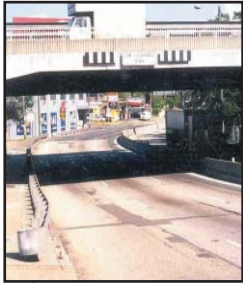
An environmental corridor for our local area!

Over the past eight years, local residents and community groups have been working to develop a GreenWay from the Cooks River at Earlwood to Iron Cove at Lilyfield. The vision is for urban renewal of a rail corridor and waterway. To support that vision a new community group called 'Friends of the GreenWay' has formed. It's now starting to happen so get on board!

A GreenWay could provide:

- » safe and pleasant walking and cycling to schools, shops and parks in the area
- » access to the popular Cooks River Cycleway and the Bay Run at Iron Cove
- » a “ribbon” of native vegetation between the two waterways, with fewer weeds
- » safe crossings under busy roads such as Parramatta Road and New Canterbury Road

OUR OWN GREEN CORRIDOR - a GreenWay vision!

A COMMUNITY PATHWAY & CYCLEWAY NETWORK - The possibility to create a safe, convenient network of pathways and cycleways! They can lead from the GreenWay "spine" to connect with schools, shops, parks and recreation areas, public transport and work places. It would be possible to walk and ride safely and enjoyably from the Cooks River through to Iron Cove over gentle topography and in a pleasant setting.



RESTORE A WATERWAY

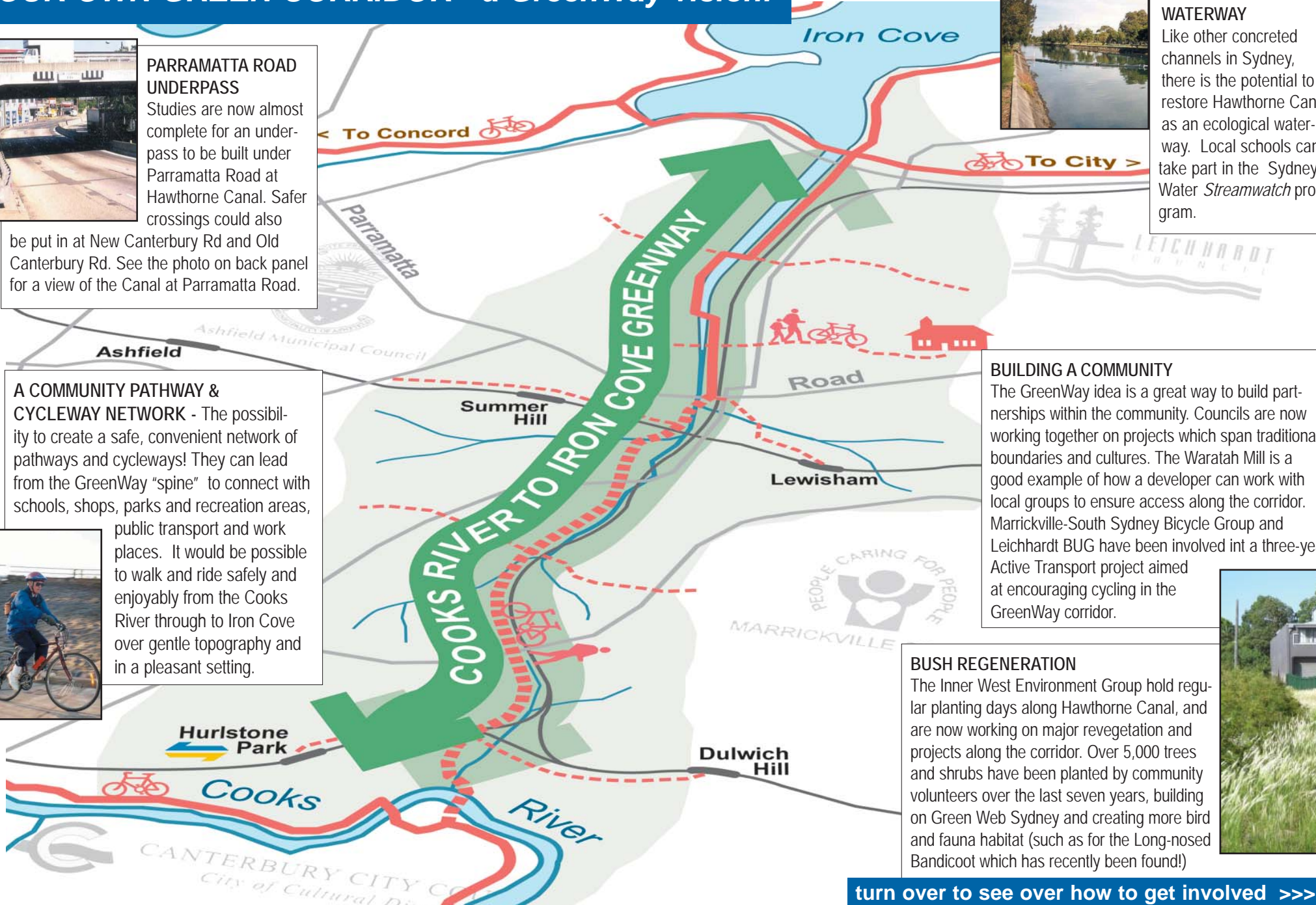
Like other concreted channels in Sydney, there is the potential to restore Hawthorne Canal as an ecological waterway. Local schools can take part in the Sydney Water *Streamwatch* program.

BUILDING A COMMUNITY

The GreenWay idea is a great way to build partnerships within the community. Councils are now working together on projects which span traditional boundaries and cultures. The Waratah Mill is a good example of how a developer can work with local groups to ensure access along the corridor. Marrickville-South Sydney Bicycle Group and Leichhardt BUG have been involved in a three-year Active Transport project aimed at encouraging cycling in the GreenWay corridor.

BUSH REGENERATION

The Inner West Environment Group hold regular planting days along Hawthorne Canal, and are now working on major revegetation and projects along the corridor. Over 5,000 trees and shrubs have been planted by community volunteers over the last seven years, building on Green Web Sydney and creating more bird and fauna habitat (such as for the Long-nosed Bandicoot which has recently been found!)
